300 and 400-level literature courses taught by the Foreign Languages and Literatures Department and 300 and 400-level courses directly related to Latin America, Spain, or other countries or populations of Hispanic heritage.

Study Abroad: PSU has many SA programs that can be used by Spanish majors and minors. Financial Aid can be used to pay for SA. Credit: If the content of a SA course matches the content of a PSU course, it will be transferred to the major or minor using the equivalent PSU course number. If the content doesn't match, the course will be given a number of 199, 299, 399, 404, 408 or 410. Some of these courses can be used in place of required courses. SA courses cannot be assigned a number higher than 410. The amount of credit received is based on the number of contact hours in the course. Courses are evaluated for credit and number after you complete your SA program. Please meet with an advisor at the Study Abroad office for more information.

IEEE Internships Abroad: PSU has many internship opportunities available in Spanish speaking countries. Interns may receive up to 12 units of PSU credits for participation in an internship. Participants in Spanish speaking countries will automatically receive 4 P/NP units of SPAN 404. In order to receive a letter grade, prior arrangements must be made with Dr. Núñez (5-8785).
